

Understanding Early Learning Goal - Children follow instructions involving several ideas or actions. They answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories or events.

Characteristics of Effective Learning

Alfie has now settled and made several close friendships. He will engage in activities with support and encouragement. Alfie prefers to play in areas he is familiar with and, with adult support will sometimes try new experiences.

During group time, Alfie is quiet and sometimes needs support to focus and respond to a question. Alfie is developing his ability to recognise when he has done something well and accept the praise that is given to him.

Judgement: Emerging

Alfie was making a kite and wanted a piece of string. When the adult asked what he needed to do next, he replied "I gotta get string." The adult asked what do we need to cut the string? Alfie pointed to the scissors and said "them."

Alfie put the cars back in the box when asked to during tidy up time.

When Alfie was asked why he was lining up, he said "cos it's lunch time."

An adult asked Alfie to put his model on top of the cupboard. He said "Yeah, I'm puttin it there so it don't get broken." He placed it on top of the cupboard.

Alfie was playing schools with his friend. Harry said "Alfie you sit on the little chair cos I'm the teacher" Alfie sat on the little chair.
